#### **APPELLANTS' MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE AN OVER-LENGTH REPLY BRIEF**

**COMES NOW** Appellants/Defendants FATHI YUSUF and UNITED CORPORATION, by and through undersigned counsel, pursuant to VISCR 22(f). In support of this motion for expedited review, the Appellants/Defendants state as follows:

1. Appellants' reply brief in the above captioned matter is due to be filed by July 5, 2013.

2. Pursuant to VISCR. 22, Appellants' reply brief should be limited to 15 pages.

3. Appellants' reply brief exceeds the 15-page limit. Appellant's brief contains is currently 19 pages in length.

4. For the following reasons, Appellants request leave to file the reply brief in excess of the page limitation of VISCR 22.

a. This case involved a complicated factual background and involved a two day evidentiary hearing with extensive exhibits admitted into evidence.

b. The record is quite complex, with over 450 pages of transcripts and 42 exhibits.

c. Appellants believe that there are four issues to be discussed, many of which have discrete sub-parts. Undersigned counsel could not do justice to Appellants' arguments in fewer pages than in which that argument is contained.

d. Despite having been through multiple drafts of the brief and significant efforts to edit and truncate the arguments, undersigned counsel believes that he cannot effectively advance Appellants' substantial arguments within the page limitation contained in VISCR. 22.

5. The undersigned had prior obligations that precluded him filing the instant motion before today. Specifically, the undersigned flew on Friday June 28<sup>th</sup>, from Miami, Florida to Charleston, South Carolina, for his law school friend's wedding. On Sunday June 30<sup>th</sup>, the undersigned flew from Charleston, South Carolina to St. Thomas (via Miami). On Monday July 1<sup>st</sup>, the undersigned picked a jury before Judge Carroll in *People of the Virgin Islands v. Lenny Alfred.* On July 2<sup>nd</sup>, the undersigned flew back from St. Thomas to Miami. Accordingly, the undersigned has only had two full days to work on the Appellants Reply Brief, since Appellee filed his answering brief, to wit: July 3<sup>rd</sup> and July 5<sup>th</sup>.

And of course yesterday was the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

**WHEREFORE,** in the interests of justice, it is respectfully requested that this Court permit the Appellants to file a reply brief in excess of the page limitations set forth in VISCR 22.
