RENEWED MOTION TO SHOW CAUSE

On October 15, 2014, the Plaintiff filed a motion to show cause because Fathi Yusuf had again failed to abide by the informal admonition of the Master comply with the Preliminary Injunction and (1) restore Waleed Hamed to the payroll and (2) pay all employees by electronic deposit, as had been done from the issuance of the preliminary injunction up to the September 29, 2014 payroll. In response to this renewed motion, the Master noted (see **Exhibit A**):

It is not in defendant's best interest to unilaterally make changes to established and existing processes and procedures. The injunction preserved the status quo and such should remain unless the Court or the Master approves changes. Yusuf

¹ This was the third time this happened, with the Court being notified of each event. Each time it led to the employees receiving a single signor paycheck (instead of a direct deposit) that had to be "cashed" by Plaza using funds taken from the store receipts before deposit -- since there was no way for Yusuf to obtain these funds under the Pl.

has no authority to remove anyone from the payroll; if he did, he should immediately reverse his action and restore Waleed to pay status.

In response, Yusuf and his counsel derided Plaintiff's filing, complaining about the lack of a supporting declaration, <u>suggesting</u> the facts stated therein were untrue. Yusuf then filed with a sworn statement signed by his accountant claiming these events never happened!

Of course, Yusuf's contempt towards this Court's Order did not change, as the same series of events happened with the payroll this week. Single signor checks were issued and cashed with store receipts and Wally Hamed was not paid. Thus, this Court is now confronted with (1) the problem of Yusuf ignoring its order even after being reminded of it by the Master, and (2) his blatant efforts to downplay this willful misconduct by having his accountant deny it ever happened.

Thus, as requested by Defendants, the attached declarations confirm that this process started when Fathi Yusuf directed the employee in charge of payroll to take Waleed Hamed off the payroll, which was followed by emails from Yusuf Yusuf asking if his father's directive had been complied with. See Exhibit B. When the employee refused due to the lack of a Court order, Fathi Yusuf then implemented the current system to circumvent this payment. See Exhibit B. Moreover, Mafi Hamed was never asked to sign any payroll checks before they were cashed with only one signature (a violation by itself). See Exhibit C. To the contrary, the employees were falsely told the Hameds were not willing to pay them — that Mafi had refused to sign, requiring the checks to be cashed, when the checks were never presented to him until well after the checks were cashed.

To compound matters, this Court (through the Master) admonished the Defendants about this conduct, as noted above.² Thus, the Court needs to address these issues by *taking testimony from the employees and parties involved*, as someone is now being dishonest with this Court.

In short, despite a clear warning to stop any such conduct, Yusuf continues to both violate this Court's Preliminary Injunction and to flaunt the judicial process so he can do what he wants as opposed following the orders of this Court. It is respectfully submitted that the integrity of the Court cannot permit such conduct to continue in violation of this Court's Preliminary Injunction, particularly after an appropriate admonition was given by the Master to try to head off this issue.



DECLARATION OF WADDA CHARRIEZ

- I, Wadda Charriez, declare, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. Section 1746, as follows:
- 1. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein.
- 2. I am a payroll clerk and office manager for the Plaza East store.
- 3. The payroll for the bulk of the store employees is approved and paid electronically by direct deposit.
- 4. Pursuant to the Order of this Court, the payroll is prepared by me for approval by one member of the Yusuf family and one member of the Hamed family, which approval is done on Monday of each week after I send a text saying the payroll is ready.



- 5. This process has worked without a problem since the entry of the Preliminary Injunction in this case.
- 6. Fathi Yusuf told me to take Waleed Hamed off the payroll in mid-September, 2014. Because of this Court's Order, I told him I could not do it unless there was a court order.
- 7. I then received two follow-up emails from Yusuf Yusuf reminding me of his father's directives, which are attached. **Group Exhibit 1** However, as I did not have a court order, I did not take Waleed Hamed off the payroll.
- 8. To get around this problem, another employee (Lavena Bartlett) manually changed the payroll, deleting Waleed Hamed's name and then printing the employees' paychecks without using direct deposit, which she did at the direction of Fahti Yusuf.
- 9. Thus, the payroll checks for that week were given to the employees with only one signature, which the employees had to cash at the store since there was not a second signature.
- 10. This process has been repeated each week since then, with me preparing the electronic direct deposit for all employees (including Waleed Hamed) to be approved by one member of each family. However, rather than use this system, Lavena Bartlett or John Gaffney has instead altered the payroll by deleting Waleed Hamed's name and then printing payroll checks. These checks are then signed by a Yusuf family member and then handed to each employee to cash.

11. This same process occurred again this week. Attached as **Exhibit 2** is the excerpt from the payroll I prepared and entered on October 20, 2014. I then printed it on October 21st at 8:59 a.m., which shows Waleed Hamed as an employee. Attached as **Exhibit 3** is the payroll as changed by Lavena Bartlett on October 22nd, that does not contain Waleed Hamed's name so that no check is printed for him. Similar print-outs exist for each pay period since September 29, 2014.





- 1. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein.
- 2. I am the designated Hamed manager for the Plaza East store.
- 3. Normally I would co-sign all checks.
- 4. Payroll checks paid electronically by direct deposit have my electronic signature that is used once I give electronic approval of the weekly payroll.
- 5. Since the electronic system has been by-passed, the payroll checks are not presented to me for payment before they are given to the employees . to cash at the store.
- 6. Initially I would write a check to Waleed Hamed and have him cash it so



that he would be paid.

- 7. However, after Attorney Holt informed me that Judge Ross wanted the situation to stop, I no longer have done so, so that Waleed Hamed has not been paid for the last two weeks.
- 8. The employees are told I refused to sign the checks, which is why they have to cash their checks.
- 9. The cashed payroll checks have been left on my desk approximately a week later, bound together with a rubber band with no notes or instructions, as per the attached picture.
- 10. There are approximately 150 store employees, some of whom are now complaining to Wadda Charriez and me about not getting direct deposit checks.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
