## DEFENDANT, FATHI YUSUF'S MOTION FOR LEAVE, NUNC PRO TUNC, TO FILE A MOTION OVER 20 PAGES

Defendant, Fathi Yusuf ("Mr. Yusuf"), through undersigned counsel, hereby moves the Court for leave, *nunc pro tunc*, to file his Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff, Hisham Hamed's First Amended Complaint ("Complaint") which motion is twenty seven (27) pages and, in support, states as follows.<sup>1</sup>

- 1. Plaintiff's twenty three (23) page Complaint asserted eight (8) claims in total: violations of three separate provisions of the Criminally Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act ("CICO"), conversion, breach of fiduciary duty, civil conspiracy, usurpation of corporate opportunity and the "tort of outrage."
- 2. On January 9, 2017, Mr. Yusuf timely moved to dismiss all claims on statute of limitations grounds, for failure to properly plead the claims, and for failure to join a necessary and indispensable party.

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3. Given the complexity and volume of the allegations—and the multiple different arguments in favor of dismissal of the eight counts—Mr. Yusuf needed more than the twenty (20) pages allowed by the Local Rules of Civil Procedure to properly address the failures in the Complaint.

4. It was mere inadvertence—not disregard of the applicable rules of the Court—that the Motion to Dismiss at issue was filed absent a contemporaneous request for leave to file a brief with an additional seven (7) pages.

5. On the basis of the foregoing, Mr. Yusuf respectfully requests that the Court grant him leave *nunc pro tunc* to January 9, 2017, to file his twenty seven (27) page Motion to Dismiss.

6. If the Court is not so inclined, alternatively, Mr. Yusuf respectfully requests that the Court give him a *nunc pro tunc* extension to file a Motion to Dismiss the Complaint which has twenty pages (20) or less.
