7	that on July 7th, 2014, Mr. Hamed filed a complaint against
8	you.
9	Do you recall that? Not the exact date, but
10	do you know that in 2014, a lawsuit was brought?
11	A. Well, whatever it is, it is.
12	Q. Okay. And do you remember that in that date in
13	2014, attached to that complaint, was this document that
14	we've just been looking at, the Dorthea document?
15	A. Yeah.
16	Q. You remember that?
17	A. Okay.
18	Q. Okay. So as of that date in 2014, did you
19	understand that you and Mr. Hamed were now in a dispute with
20	each other in the court?
21	A. Yeah.
22	Q. Okay. Do you understand that Mr. Hamed was
23	arguing that you had a partnership and that that partnership
24	now is ending?
25	A. Yes. I end it, not he.

1	Q. You ended it?
2	A. Yes.
3	Q. Okay. And when did you end it?
4	A. When I found out.
5	Q. Okay.
6	A. I decided to end it when I find out they they
7	smuggling.
8	Q. Okay. And and after they after they brought
9	that complaint,
LO	A. Um-hum.
L1	Q. okay.
L2	A. Yes.
L3	Q. Did did you ever have any written agreement
L 4	between you and Mr. Hamed, or you and Wally Hamed, or you
L5	and anybody, that said from that date forward, from the date
L6	of that complaint, that you should act for them? That you
L7	should do things for the Hameds?
L8	A. I should what?
L9	Q. You should do any acts for the Hameds?
20	A. What?
21	Q. You can talk to your lawyer.
22	A. No, no, what he saying?
23	MR. HARTMANN: Let's pause. Let's go off
24	record.
25	THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Okay. We're going off

1	record. The time is 12:53.
2	(Short recess taken.)
3	THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Going back on record. The
4	time is 12:55.
5	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) Okay. A colloquy was held off the
6	record between counsel and Mr. Yusuf, and we've agreed on
7	how the question should be phrased.
8	Mr. Yusuf, after you ended the partnership,
9	and the complaint was brought in this case, did you later
10	become the liquidating partner?
11	A. I been assigned by the courts, yes.
12	Q. Okay. Aside from your assignment as liquidating
13	partner, did you ever have any written or oral agreement
14	with Mr. Hamed or his sons that you should act for the
15	partnership or for them?
16	A. No. I thought it was nothing, come in contact
17	with each other.
18	Q. Okay. That's fine.
19	(Deposition Exhibit No. H-1 Exhibit 10 was
20	marked for identification.)
21	I'm going to show you an exhibit marked
22	Exhibit H-1, 10, Exhibit 10. This is another one of those
23	lawyer documents that you don't like.
24	Do you understand that there have been
25	several different cases brought by all the different parties

1 in this lawsuit and that some of them have been consolidated 2 into this case? They've been brought together into this 3 single case? 4 Α. Yeah, I'm aware of it. 5 Q. You are aware? 6 Some of it, yeah. I don't know which and which. Α. 7 Okay. And -- and do you know if the matters Ο. 8 regarding Dorthea, do -- do you recall whether the matters 9 regarding Dorthea were originally brought as a separate 10 case, but are now consolidated in this case? 11 Α. No, I don't know. 12 MR. HARTMANN: Counsel, will you stipulate? 1.3 MS. PERRELL: I'd have to look exactly. 14 know -- I thought that --MR. HARTMANN: All you have to do is 15 stipulate that this is a valid consolidation. 16 MS. PERRELL: There is a consolidation. 17 18 don't know that I agree with exactly the way you've worded 19 it, which is my issue. 20 MR. HARTMANN: Okay. There is a consolidation. And 21 MS. PERRELL: 22 the reason I'm not going to agree with your statement is 23 that as I recall, even at one point in time in the 370 case, 2.4 Mr. Yusuf raised the Dorthea issue separate and apart from

any and all outside claims, so as part of a reconciliation.

2	with what your statement is, but it has been consolidated,

25	that paragraph, look for the sentence that starts out "The

1	funds."
2	A. Yes, it says here 900,000.
3	Q. Yeah. I want the sentence that says it's about
4	halfway down the paragraph. Starts out with the words "The
5	funds were not paid."
6	A. Where's the funds are not paid? Where?
7	MS. PERRELL: Can I direct him?
8	MR. HARTMANN: Yeah, sure.
9	MS. PERRELL: Now I'm trying to find it
10	upside down.
11	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) I'll read it to make it easier for
12	everybody.
13	"The funds were not paid in a lump sum, but
14	rather periodically and often late."
15	Were the funds paid late sometimes, if you
16	can recall?
17	A. I don't know. I don't know what to tell you.
18	Q. But you said let me let me strike that
19	question and answer, ask it a different way.
20	You said you don't recall you don't have
21	any documents that show when you received any of the funds?
22	A. Yeah, I don't have.
23	Q. Okay.

You've never disputed that, right? You've never --

- A. I dispute -- I don't dispute the one and a half million.
 - Q. Okay.
- A. Not half of it is seven fifty minus the one fifty Mohammed Hamed owes for 10 years. He kept it.
- Q. Okay. And I guess -- I guess part of the question I'm trying to ask here is that 800 -- that money, whatever you owe. You aren't saying a number. Whatever money you owe, is money that was owed under that original contract that was entered into in 2000, right? The original sale contract. This was payment. You're simply saying this is payment for the land and the condominiums?

1	A. Right.
2	Q. And that you collected all that money?
3	A. I collect 600 on his behalf.
4	Q. Okay. And you still have all that money?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. Okay. And I don't want to ask I don't
7	answer this very slowly, and maybe talk to your counsel
8	before you answer, but all of the money you received from
9	Salem, except the one fifty we talked about.

12	receive that all as cash money or did you receive other

20	do you know the date you received those other things?

25	A. I never discuss no business whatsoever with Wally

1	Hamed. I say that and he hearing me.
2	Q. Okay.
3	A. Not one word, even though we discuss
4	Q. Did you ever discuss it with Mohammad Hamed?
5	A. No Mohammad Hamed.
6	Q. Okay.
7	A. I saw Mohammad Hamed maybe twice, 10 minute each.
8	Q. Okay. Are there any documents that you have that
9	show when that other stuff, the noncash stuff you received,
10	was received
11	A. I don't have the document.
12	Q. Let me just finish.
13	Was received in relationship to when you
14	asked Shawn Hamed to sign the transfer of the stock?
15	A. I honestly don't have anything right now.
16	Q. Okay. Did you ever have?
17	A. Yeah, I have in the past.
18	Q. You had in the past?
19	A. I don't know. I honestly don't know when I
20	received this money. I did receive the 600, but when I
21	receive it, I don't know.
22	Q. But it wasn't money? It wasn't 600
23	A. No, I received in substitute for his money and my

23	MS. PERRELL: Oh, oh, okay. I thought he

13	remember when all of the value was received, but do you have
14	any recollection whether it was many years before or shortly
15	before this was signed, or you don't know?
16	A. I honestly don't remember.
17	Q. You don't know?
18	A. Honestly.
19	Q. Okay.
20	A. Honestly, I don't remember.
21	Q. Okay. All right.
22	A. This was very, very minor things for me to
23	remember.
24	Q. Okay. Do the original contract indicates that
25	the payments were supposed to be made in 2001, 2002, 2003,

1 and 2004. 2 Do you -- does that help refresh any 3 recollection? 4 Α. It could be, it could be not. I'm not sure. 5 Q. Okay. All right. With regard to the amount, to 6 the extent there would be any amount due to the Hameds on 7 this amount, what amount are you contending would be due? 8 Α. No more than 600 in particular for -- for Dorthea. 9 Okay. And the 600 is because it's the eight -0-Ο. 10 two minus --11 Α. Their share is seven fifty. The eighty-two --12 eight-two nine thirty-two was giving it to them back. I 13 mean, not eighty-two, fifty-two. 14 Well, let's --Ο. Fifty-two, I think. Half of the one -0- two. 15 Whatever it is. His share, whatever it is amount money, he 16 17 gets it back in his house, in his own house in the city where he live and in front of his wife. The man pass away, 18 God bless him. His wife still alive. She can be asked. I 19 20 took that money. 21 Q. Okay. 22 Α. And I check with Wally, and there's money -- his 23 brother have two account in Amman, Jordan. 2.4 Q. Okay.

And we came up with it, calculation, and he end

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up -- I end up own him 18,361. I told his father to go ahead and draw 18,361. Excuse me, U.S. currency. He went ahead and draw Jordanian currency, which is one dollar only worth 70 percent of the Jordanian currency.

- Q. Okay. Let me just --
- A. It's clear I told Mr. Hamed, 18,361, you can go ahead and draw. He use it, but he draw U.S. -- Jordanian currency. Seventy percent, 30 percent more. It hurts me when I see these thing from an old man. God bless him. He's -- he's someplace else now.
- Q. All right. I just want to get back to these numbers.

So just so that we're clear, we're looking at Exhibit Number 8, which is the handwritten document --

- A. Yes.
- Q. -- that you -- your internal calculations?
- 17 **A.** Yes.
 - Q. Okay. So the first number is 1,500,000. That's for the sale of the Dorthea property?
 - A. That's the value of -- the full value of the Dorthea property.
 - Q. Okay. And then the next number, which is the one --
 - A. This is a loan was given to a friend of mine. I asked Mr. Mohammad Hamed at that time to go ahead and give

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him 75,000 dinar. The dinar equal to hundred and five nine thirty-two U.S. currency. I add them together, and I end up owing this.

But after I give them this paper, I went to Jordan and I give him his money right in front of his own wife. Whatever, it's 52,000 and change.

- Q. Okay. So what you're saying is, is that this number that's in the calculation here was addressed subsequent to this --
- A. Way before I make this 52, whatever his share is from the loan.
- Q. Okay. Just let me finish, 'cause she's going to get upset.
 - A. Yeah.
 - Q. She won't be able to take us down.
 - A. No, no.
- Q. So what I want to understand is that the handwritten document, the second number, which is the 105,000 and change, and then it comes again three sentences -- three lines later, hundred and five. Your point is that that is taken off the table. It shouldn't be as part of the calculation for what's owed on Dorthea?
 - **A.** Exactly.
- Q. That's one thing. So now we're back to the one million five.

1	A. Exactly.
2	Q. Okay. Now, the next question is, of the one
3	million five that was overall value received, a hundred and
4	fifty thousand was transferred to the batch plan. And your
5	position is that that was coming out of Mr. Hamed's share?
6	A. Share, because it's to pay back the money we give
7	him 10 years earlier to give him.
8	Q. Right.
9	A. To deliver it.
10	Q. So so he would be owed originally half of
11	the of the one million five hundred?
12	A. I owe him 600 out of the one million five hundred.
13	Q. Okay. Because he would normally be owed seven
14	fifty?
15	A. He's entitled to seven fifty, but he owes one
16	fifty. I we pay him. His son even I told his son to
17	go ahead and deposit one fifty. He decide to deposit to his
18	father over \$40,000 too much and I asked him for it and he's
19	absolutely deny it, he ever make deposit in his father name.
20	Q. Okay. But you took care of that because
21	A. I took care of it because it's clear.
22	Q. Okay.
23	A. Mohammad Hamed account is in St. Croix and the
24	fund was deposited from St. Thomas. And it says deposit in
25	St. Thomas to Mohammad Hamed in St. Croix. He was

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depositing. The gentleman is here. He deposit \$30-40,000 too much more than what he was told, and yet, unfortunately, when I discovered the wrongdoing, I went to him, approach him, he denied completely.

- Q. Okay. I just -- let's keep it just on this one.

 So that's how you get to the 600,000?
- A. Right.
- Q. 1.5 divided by two and then you take out an additional one fifty for Mr. Hamed?
 - A. That's exactly what I did.

MS. PERRELL: Okay. All right. No further questions.

REDIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. HARTMANN:

- Q. This whole idea that the eight hundred two you subtract money out of it that -- that you just talked about?
 - A. Only I subtract --
 - Q. That whole idea is new?
 - A. The whole thing is, from beginning to end, is me.
- Q. No, no, no. What I'm saying is, your lawyers submitted two different claim documents. One was called the original accounting claims, which we've marked H-1 Exhibit 11, and another one, which is H-1 Exhibit 12. And in both of those documents -- well, let's look at the first document.

Q.

1	The last line says, "As a result of the
2	various adjustments reflected on Exhibit 1," which was the
3	written document, the handwritten document, "802,966 should
4	be allocated to Hamed."
5	So when you filed your claim in this case,
6	that whole hundred fifty argument, that didn't exist, did
7	it? In other words, it's not in this?
8	A. My lawyer was told. If he did not put it, and the
9	proof is still there, clear like the sun, it's bank
10	document, it's not document that I made.
11	Q. So it's your lawyer's fault?
12	A. With respect to him, I could say he miss it.

20	A. I I have my lawyer knows about it.
21	Q. Okay. So so if your lawyer didn't put anything
22	in there about the reduction of a hundred fifty back when
23	the claim was actually made
24	A. He had the document.

-- to the Court, that's just -- that's an error by

1	your lawyer, right?
2	A. No, no. We I give him the document.
3	Q. Yeah. All right. I don't doubt it.
4	A. If I gave the document, that document in the file.
5	Q. Okay.
6	A. My lawyer's always working in my behalf. I never
7	look,
8	Q. Okay.
9	A examine my lawyer what he doing.
10	Q. Well, a lot of times, your lawyers just make
11	mistakes. That's the way it goes.
12	I guess what I'm asking is, when you took the
13	original document to Hamed, you said you took it to either
14	Willie or to Shawn, the handwritten document?
15	A. Okay.
16	Q. It showed \$802,000. It didn't show \$600,000?
17	A. This was not I did not take it. I took it to
18	way before the release. Way, way before the release.
19	Q. I see.
20	A. I don't remember. I took it the time I made the
21	sale.
22	Q. So I'm confused now.
23	You went to you went to the Hameds and you
24	said to them, I I need to get your signature, right?
25	A. That's way later after I get paid completely and

1	after this document was already in their possession.
2	Q. So you think now that maybe this document was
3	written at some other time? It wasn't? It's Exhibit 8 to
4	Claim H-1.
5	MS. PERRELL: This one.
6	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) When was that money you said
7	that there was a transfer of 75,000 dinars from the Jordan
8	fund.
9	When was that?
10	A. That was not transfer, sir. That 75 dinar, it was
11	not transfer.
12	Q. When did it occur?
13	A. It was told. I don't remember. And it was
14	this account was under the control of Mohammad Hamed.
15	Q. But this document
16	A. I told the man, Give him 75,000 dinar. So I held
17	responsible by giving him, and nothing wrong with it. The
18	man paid me back the money, and right away, I give Mr. Hamed
19	his share, because it's his money.
20	Q. But you don't know when that was?
21	A. I don't remember.
22	Q. And you don't know when
23	A. Way before 2012. Way, way before that.
24	Q. Okay. So so when your when your lawyers

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- Q. Okay. Okay. At Page 105 of your original deposition, which is Exhibit Claim H-1, 4, you were asked this: "And when did you get that money?" In other words, when did you get the money that we're talking about here.
 - A. Don't remember.
- Q. And you said, "I get the money, I don't have a date. But that I get that money maybe, I can guarantee you, it's not three years. It's less than three years."
 - A. Whatever I said, it says.
- Q. Okay. So did you get the money less than 3 years from the deposition?
 - A. Whatever I said, I said. It's there.
 - Q. Okay. So that's correct?
 - A. Yeah. I mean, I say now.

MR. HARTMANN: I have no further questions.

RECROSS-EXAMINATION

BY MS. PERRELL:

Q. I have one more follow-up.

With regard to Exhibit 4, there's some indication that somehow this is -- this is new or that this was somewhat confused.

In your deposition at Page 101, in response to various questions, you stated the following: "Up to now, he denying (the) money. That money, I give him (a hundred and fifty) to deliver to the batch plant, and he" -- "and he

1 claim that the batch plant is ours." It is not ours. We 2 just put him to let the two fight together. 3 I don't know what that means. But isn't it 4 true that you discussed this batch plant for a hundred and 5 fifty in the context of the receipt of the Dorthea money in 6 a prior deposition? 7 MR. HARTMANN: Huh? Object. 8 MS. PERRELL: Okay. 9 MR. HARTMANN: I don't know what my objection 10 is. 11 (Ms. Perrell) Isn't it true that this is your 12 deposition testimony? I know you said you don't recall, but it was in 2004. 13 14 MR. HARTMANN: '14. 15 (Ms. Perrell) '14. Sorry. Q. 16 Α. Okay. 17 Q. And one of the statements you said is "Up to now, he denying" the money. "That money, I give him ... to 18 19 deliver to the batch plant, and he claim that the batch 20 plant is ours." 21 When we talk about the batch plant and a 22 hundred and fifty, is that the same money that you're 23 talking about? 2.4 Same money. Α. 25 All right. And --Q. Okay.

14	When you were asked to provide some
15	information as to the value of the claim, are these the
16	documents that you provided?
17	A. Yes.
18	Q. Okay. And can you explain to us what is the
19	calculation and how did you arrive at this valuation for
20	those six containers?
21	A. I remember I gave you these invoices
22	Q. Okay.
23	A as an example and
24	Q. So Mr. Yusuf,
25	A. Yes, go ahead.

- Q. -- you -- you worked at the St. Thomas store for many, many years, correct?
 - A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. And so during your time working in the store in St. Thomas, were you familiar with the types of products that you would store in the containers in St. Thomas?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And can you tell us, generally speaking, what kinds of product you stored in the containers outside the store in St. Thomas?
- A. Nothing -- something with a long expiration date. It's a dry container. There's no -- no refrigerated item. And no -- it have to be pack in a strong vacuum package, otherwise -- you can't put water, because if you put water, it's contain in a plastic container and that does not take load. Or Clorox, it's too dangerous. You can't put water, you can't put Clorox. Yes, you could put tuna fish, sardine, paper towel, anything that does not break that easy or bust, you know, damage or leak, 'cause if you leak, it will damage everything. And the weight is no question ask, because the trailer's not on the highway, and filled to capacity.
 - Q. Okay.
 - A. If we need the room, we just fill to capacity.

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1	Q. Okay. And so how many years were you at the
2	St. Thomas store?
3	A. About 22 years.
4	Q. Okay. And so over those 22 years, you're familiar
5	with the kinds of things that you stored in those containers
6	in St. Thomas?
7	A. Yeah, I have a little experience, but the one that
8	is really familiar is the is the people that works, the
9	manager, you know. I'm I don't know what's in the
10	trailer, but I know something that water, we can't afford
11	to put it, because it will bust. It doesn't have any
12	strength. And the Clorox, no. You put paper towel. You
13	put rice. You put canned goods. That's what you put.
14	Q. Okay.
15	A. Something really hard. It could stand temperature
16	and strong.
17	Q. Okay. And the document that you provided, which
18	is this Exhibit 7, how did you calculate how many
19	trailers are there?
20	A. Here is three container I give you.
21	Q. Okay. What are their sizes?
22	A. 3,300 cubic foot and 40 40 cubic foot and
23	20 cubic foot. I mean, 45-footer, 40-footer, and 20-footer,
24	and the cube.

Q. Okay. And then you -- how did you arrive at

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1 the -- the value that you arrived at here of 415,000? I have give it to you. I don't know. I give it 2 3 to you on the paper. I don't know what it is. 4 Q. Okay. 5 Α. But I -- what I did, I used standard high cube container. It can never be more than 2,700 cube. That's 6 7 the largest, 40-footer or a 20-footer. But the -- the one 8 we have on -- on -- for storage purposes, it's a 45 in 9 length with 3,300 in cube. 10 Q. Okay. 11 And this, the 40 and the 20, it have restriction 12 on weight in the highway. And these 45, because it's not 13 traveling, it's not moving, is no restriction on it. 14 Okay. So you're saying you could load these 0. down --15 16 Α. 12	Q correct? Hang on. You got to
13	MR. HARTMANN: Yeah, you also now you're
14	testifying. You can he's your witness. You can't lead
15	him like that. I mean, I don't mind if you lead, actually.
16	I'm just saying technically, you can't.
17	MS. PERRELL: Okay.
18	MR. HARTMANN: You got to ask him a question.
19	Q. (Ms. Perrell) So these receipts
20	A. Now I notice what I wrote. It's right here.
21	Q. Okay.
22	A. The 40-footer, I give you several invoices and
23	estimate 35,000 worth \$35,000 in cargo.
24	If I put that into the 40-footer, it will end
25	up being \$79,545. The 20-footer, it came up to \$18,000 in

value. And if I puts it in the 45-footer, it will be -- end up 81,818.

Q. Okay.

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- A. Now I -- I see it, Attorney Hartmann, where my writing is. And I -- I don't need her, with her respect, I don't need her information. It's already here.
- Q. Okay. And so this Exhibit Number 7 is a calculation that you have made and --
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. -- you believe it's a fair and accurate --
- A. This is very fair. Wally and his brother is here. They could tell you it's 45-foot -- 40-footer is 35,000.

 It's a fair average cargo --
 - Q. Okay.
- A. -- because you cannot -- most of the trailer we receive, 40-footer. We never receive it full, because it hit maximum weight allows in the state highway. So I think the law's about 44 or 46,000 pound, where there is no limit on that 45-footer.
- Q. So what you're saying is, is you've made these calculations based upon what is --
 - A. Based on the equipment that we on the site.
- Q. Okay. And these receipts support the numbers that -- of the types of materials -- let me finish -- the types of product that would be in those containers in

2	A. Yes, 35,000 for the average 40.

8	trying to get at here, Mr. Yusuf
9	A. Yes.
10	Q. is are you the person I should be asking
11	questions about 5 and 8, or should I be asking Mike?
12	A. No, 5 and 8 is very important that I being asked.
13	Q. That you be asked?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. Okay. In your claim, your lawyers have made a
16	claim for you in this case
17	A. Yes.
18	Q for renting 5 and 8, right?
19	A. Yes.
20	Q. In your claim, it states that a particular square
21	footage, a cost per square foot, is being charged?
22	A. Yes, sir.
23	Q. Okay. Who where does that cost per square foot
24	come from?
25	A. All right, sir. The number is it came from the

previous tenant, Ali Hardware. I was renting it for \$5 a square foot, plus maintenance and property tax.

When I build the Plaza Extra, I billing just dollar fifteen a square foot for maintenance and I forget to bill for the property tax. That's is for Number 8. It does not come out of my head. It come out from the previous tenants. And the -- then Plaza used the place for 7-8 years. And then we open up Frederiksted. We don't need 8 no more. We thought we don't need 8 anymore. So I have a tenant and I will rent that to Robert Hill, some company, a wholesaler in St. Croix. He took it, I think, for -- I don't remember what -- how many years. And after that, he left.

We realize that we should never rent it, because even though we have Plaza West with a huge warehouse capacity, still, we should never rent it to Robert Hill because we need this to be close by --

24	testimony	as to whether what he knows as to cost per
25	square fo	ot. So he knows nothing about this document, but

1	that doesn't necessarily mean that he doesn't know the cost
2	per square foot.
3	MR. HARTMANN: And what is your objection?
4	MS. PERRELL: My objection is it misstates
5	the testimony, your question.
6	MR. HARTMANN: What does?
7	MS. PERRELL: Your question. So you know
8	nothing about the square footage? You asked him if he knew
9	anything about this document.
10	MR. HARTMANN: So you're arguing that my
11	question is compound.
12	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) Okay. You know nothing about this
13	document, right?
14	A. This document
15	Q. Okay.
16	A I never seen before.
17	Q. Okay. See the column here that says cost per
18	square foot and it goes down?
19	A. Yeah, yeah.
20	Q. Do you know anything about where those numbers
21	came from?
22	A. I don't know.
23	Q. Okay. Do you know do you know whether those
24	numbers are accurate or not?
25	A. I said, sir

1	Q. I know. Your client
2	A. That's it. When I tell you
3	Q. Your lawyer is making me ask
4	THE COURT REPORTER: I'm sorry. One at a
5	time.
6	A. I don't know about. I have never seen this
7	before.
8	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) I understand. And I'm asking you,
9	do you know where these numbers come from?
10	A. I would assume from books. Maybe from the book.
11	Q. Okay. The bay
12	A. But that does not mean
13	Q. Sir,
14	A I receive this.
15	Q you have to let me ask a question.
16	A. I tell you, I have never seen it. I have never
17	seen it.
18	Q. I understand. Your lawyer's objecting to my
19	asking the question that way. I have to ask you the
20	question this way. Okay.
21	A. Go ahead.
22	Q. So for Bay 5, for instance, it says in here that
23	it's a certain number of square feet, 3,125. And the cost
24	per the rental cost per square foot is \$7.01; is that
25	right?

That is impossible. What date is that? 1 Α. What is 2 the date here? 3 Ο. 8-22-01.4 Α. '01? '01. 5 Q. 6 What is that, '01? Α. 7 MS. PERRELL: You have to -- you have to 8 answer. 9 (Mr. Hartmann) August 2001. Ο. 10 Α. No way. 11 So this is wrong? Ο. 12 Α. The store was using it. The store was using that 13 warehouse. 14 Look, when we open in 1994, I was in St. Thomas. I came and I was surprised to see my building 15 tearing apart, and I get angry, because I am the owner of 16 17 that building. But Wally was smart enough, each time he do something he knows I don't like, he used to put my son with 18 I say, Mike, you know about this? He say, Yes, Daddy, 19 20 we need it and so. I say, Wally, you have to pay rent for 21 this. He said, I will pay rent. 22 Because, sir, you's a lawyer and I respect 23 your profession. You need to respect my profession. When 24 we order trailers -- one time we order 17 container in one

item when the price is right. That's why the warehouse is

1 very, very important to be available. 2 We order sardine one trailer. Take us 2 3 years to move it, but to get -- to be a competitive 4 retailer, you have to buy wholesale. And that's why -- now, 5 look at Plaza Extra, any supermarket have between 60 to 6 70,000 item. And you can't put more than one case. And the 7 most cases you can -- the real strong moving item, you might 8 put 4-5 cases. But the one you move 4-5 cases, you always 9 have at least a container in the ware -- in the warehouse, 10 'cause, you know, we receive one shipment every month. 11 Every week. 12 Q. Sir --We can't be out of merchandise on the shelf. 1.3 Α. 14 Could I ask you another question? 0. You've testified that you've -- that document 15 I was showing you, the accounts receivable, you've never 16 17 seen that or any document like that, okay? If there was someone inside the United 18 19 organization who could testify about what's on this 20 document? 21 Excuse me, before I can answer you, could you give 22 me the -- please, the date when 12 was rented to Plaza? 23 MS. PERRELL: What he's asking, and I know 2.4 this is pending, so here's -- let me put this on the record. 25 I think it would assist my -- can I ask him

1	whether it would assist him to understand the dates, 'cause
2	he's already put this in the declaration? In his own
3	declaration?
4	MR. HARTMANN: You can give him anything you
5	want.
6	MS. PERRELL: All right.
7	MR. HARTMANN: You can actually, if you
8	want to give the answer for him, I'd be happy with that.
9	No, I'm dead serious.
10	A. Excuse me, sir, I don't need an answer. I'm 77
11	years of age and she's the age of one of my daughters.
12	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) Sometimes lawyers can put it in
13	lawyer speak.
14	A. Come on, now. Listen, when this man tear up my
15	building, the first tenant after 1994, it was the guy who
16	rented for 12. No middle tenant rented it.
17	MR. HARTMANN: Can we can we go off the
18	record for a second, Counsel?
19	A. That's why I have a strong argument.
20	MR. HARTMANN: Counsel?
21	MS. PERRELL: Yeah.
22	THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Going off the record. The
23	time is 2:03.
24	(Short recess taken.)
25	THE VIDEOGRAPHER: Going on the record. The

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1	time is 2:07.
2	Q. (Mr. Hartmann) Okay. You said that in addition to
3	Plaza Extra, you had other tenants in there, Mr. Yusuf, in
4	Bay 5?
5	A. I I had before, I think it was the pharmacy.
6	And we catch fire. After the fire, it was vacant. And we
7	build the store in 1994. We reopen it and they tear up the
8	wall. This is adjacent to Plaza Extra. He tear up 25 feet
9	of that wall completely.
10	Q. I understand. The question is, are there other
11	tenants?
12	A. Excuse me. No, no, wait a minute.
13	After Plaza Extra, there is no tenant
14	whatsoever took that place, except the people, the Diamond
15	Girl, and they were paying \$12. That's why I base my rent
16	based on Diamond Girl rent.
17	Q. Okay. So there was another tenant, Diamond?
18	A. It was the pharmacy.
19	Q. Okay.
20	A. Part of the pharmacy, which is why I mean, I
21	think it burned down, the pharmacy, or or close down?
22	Q. That's all right.
23	A. Close down. Okay.
24	Q. She can't answer. You told her not to answer.

A. No, I don't remember. No, I'm talking to my son,

1	not to her.
2	Q. Oh, okay. So so when you had this other tenant
3	in there, you had a lease; is that correct?
4	A. After the fire, sir. After Plaza Extra fire, the
5	first tenant called me, myself, a tenant. The first tenant
6	was Plaza Extra East. The second tenant was Diamond Girl.
7	Q. Okay, good.
8	A. Diamond Girl is \$12.
9	Q. Now, when you had Diamond in there, did Diamond
10	have a lease?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. Okay. And when Plaza was in there, did Plaza have
13	a lease?
14	A. No.
15	Q. Okay. And on the Diamond lease, it said they
16	could be there for a certain amount of time, right?
17	A. Yes.
18	Q. And you couldn't move them out just one day
19	because you felt like it, could you?
20	A. I don't want to move them out.
21	Q. Oh, no, of course not, 'cause they're a
22	rent-paying tenant
23	A. Yes.
24	Q so you want them in there for the period of the
25	lease?

1	A.	Yes.
2	Q.	And and they paid you \$12
3	A.	Yeah.
4	Q.	so that you couldn't move them out so they
5	could use	it; is that correct?
6	A.	Yeah,
7	Q.	Okay.
8	A.	that's exactly what happened.
9	Q.	But you could move Plaza Extra out any time?
10	A.	What?
11	Q.	Could you move Plaza Extra out any time?
12	A.	Yes.
13	Q.	Okay. So they weren't really a tenant?
14	A.	Who?
15	Q.	Plaza Extra?
16	A.	It's not a free world.
17	Q.	No, I'm not asking
18	A.	Wait.
19	Q.	I'm asking, could you move them out?
20	A.	Me and my sons. We the owner of the building.
21		Now, we have someone, outsider, who have not
22	a drop a l	olood in that building. My blood in that building.
23	I am not a	a tenant, but when Mohammad Hamed became my
24	partner, l	he is a tenant.
25	Q.	Could he could he stay there even if you wanted

1 to move Diamond in? 2 Α. What? 3 If you wanted to move Diamond in -- when you moved 4 Diamond in, didn't you just go to them and say you have to take the Plaza Extra stuff out? 5 6 Α. Who? 7 Didn't you tell him Hamed? 0. Yeah, yeah. 8 Α. You did? 9 0. 10 Α. Yeah. 11 And you could tell them to leave any time? 0. 12 Α. Yeah, because I give it to them and they used it. 13 I really feel bad to have that bays always close. It does 14 not look good for the building. But no tenant come in. 15 When the tenant come, the right one, we negotiate, and he 16 have it for \$12. 17 Q. And did you -- but what I'm asking you is, when you talked to Hameds about them using the building, at some 18 point you went to the Hameds, right, and said, Let's use 19 20 Bay 5, right? 21 Α. I never tell him, Let's use Bay 5. 22 Q. What did you say? 23 Α. He used it without my knowledge. 2.4 Q. Without your knowledge? Okay. 25 You know. Α.

1	Q. When he used it without your knowledge, did you
2	ever say to him, You need to pay me \$12 an hour (sic)?
3	A. I said, I will charge you rent.
4	Q. You did?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. And how much did you say?
7	A. I have no idea.
8	Q. You have no idea.
9	A. I have no idea.
LO	Q. So it could be \$2?
L1	A. When I have a new tenant, I establish the price.
L2	Q. And one of the things you used when you
_3	established the price is the fact that while they're there,
_4	they own it for that period of time? They can stay there
L5	for that whole year or the whole 2 years?
6	A. I don't want it, even if you pay 20. Reason why,
L7	I (sic) will hurt the shopping center.
L8	Q. You want him in there?
L9	A. I don't want him in there.
20	Q. You don't want who in there?
21	A. From day one, I don't want Plaza Extra there.
22	Q. You wanted a tenant in there?
23	A. I want a tenant, yes.
24	Q. Because the tenant will pay you full value?
25	A. Not only that this is part of it, yes, but this

is a shopping center; it's not a warehouse. 1 2 Q. Right. 3 Α. I own now warehousing and retail areas. 4 Ο. So if --5 Α. It's two different name. Two different picture. 6 Two different visitors. 7 So at any time, if you could have gotten, for 8 instance, another pharmacy, or if you could have gotten an 9 eyeglass store, or if you could have gotten something like 10 that, --11 Α. Uh-huh. 12 Q. -- you would have preferred to have them? 13 I prefer to have anybody but not Plaza Extra. Α. 14 I -- okay. And that's --Q. 15 Plaza Extra --Α. 16 -- because they would pay you full rent? Q. 17 Α. Plaza Extra -- it's not that. 18 Q. It's what? 19 Α. I tell you that is built for retail store, not for 20 warehousing. 21 Q. Okay. 22 Α. But Wally use it for a warehouse. 23 Ο. So you said that the Hameds did it without your 2.4 knowledge? 25 Without my permission. Α.

1	Q. Without your permission. And and they did it
2	without your permission for how many years?
3	A. About whatever the document said.
4	Q. Like 15 years? 20 years?
5	A. Whatever the document says.
6	MR. HARTMANN: Okay. I have no further
7	questions.
8	RECROSS-EXAMINATION
9	BY MS. PERRELL:
10	Q. Okay. Mr. Yusuf, just to clarify, when you say
11	they used it without your permission, you determined that
12	they were using the store on Bay 5 when they broke through
13	the wall, correct?
14	A. Yes, yes.
15	Q. All right. And after they broke through the wall,
16	you had a conversation with Wally, correct?
17	A. Yes.
18	MR. HARTMANN: Objection. Lead.
19	MS. PERRELL: Okay.
20	MR. HARTMANN: You got to ask him questions.
21	Q. (Ms. Perrell) Okay. Did you have a conversation
22	with Wally after he broke through the wall?
23	A. I have few words with Wally. You're going to pay
24	rent, Wally.
25	Q. Okay.

1	A. He say, Yes.
2	Q. Okay.
3	A. That's a rental.
4	Q. Okay. So at that point, you were permitting Plaza
5	Extra to use Bay 5, correct?
6	A. Yeah, I did. They put me in position I had no
7	choice.
8	Q. Okay. All right. And the same would go for
9	Bay 8?
LO	A. Bay 8 is also the store needs it.
L1	Q. Okay.
L2	A. But it does not needed a free ride.
L3	Q. Okay. All right.
L 4	A. The man stays there years.
L5	Q. Right.
L 6	A. You don't put somebody years free.
L7	Q. Right.
L8	A. And I know I know how much the store is making
L9	money.
20	Q. Okay. And so it's your testimony that your you
21	discussed it with Wally and you never had any intention for
22	them to be able to use Bay 5 and 8 for free when they were
23	using it?
24	A. Never.
25	Q. Okay. And do you know whether they were using

93 FATHI YUSUF -- RECROSS it -- during the periods that we have articulated, do you know whether they were using it continuously? Α. Definitely. Q. Okay. Α. I hear the conversation few minutes ago, he say in I want this gentleman to know that location is not a hotel to be in and out, it's a warehouse. Q. Okay. There's no in and out for -- in a warehouse. All right. With regard to Plaza Extra utilizing 0. Bays 5 and 8, just to understand, you charged them the rent that you ultimately ended up charging the tenants who came in; is that right?

A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. And in your mind, is that the clearest determination as to the fair market value of that space?
- A. Yes, plus this is right almost next door to the Plaza Extra East. Plaza Extra East receive about 4,000 customers, shopping customers, daily.
 - Q. Okay.
- A. Definitely. Ali Hardware was in the corner. Half of it is blocked and the other -- only the customer can see the other half, that's why it's six fifteen.
 - Q. Okay. That's why that rent is cheaper?
 - A. Oh, yes.

1	Q. Okay.
2	A. First, it's the size double.
3	Q. Um-hum.
4	A. Second, half of it is already block because it
5	came in the corner. You look at the sketch, you will see
6	half of it is blocked. And he was paying five, plus
7	maintenance, plus property tax.
8	I did not charge unfortunate, I forget to
9	charge the property tax. I did put one \$1.15
10	maintenance. Well, Sunny Isle pays seven ninety-five a
11	square foot maintenance.
12	Q. Okay.
13	A. You know, I pick up the garbage and I pay the
14	light bill for the parking lot, but that's included in the
15	dollar fifteen.
16	Q. Right. And Mr. Yusuf, in July of 2013, did your
17	lawyer, at the time, Nizar DeWood, demand payment for Bays 5
18	and 8, along with
19	A. I think so, yes.
20	Q. All right. And at that point in time, or in
21	response to that, did the Hameds refuse to pay or contest
22	that rent was owed?
23	A. I do not remember now.
24	Q. Okay. If the documents reflect that, you're
	_ -

not -- you're not contesting that they -- they -- they're

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1	denying it and they denied it after Nizar sent the letter?
2	A. They deny it? On what basis did they deny it?
3	Q. No, I'm just asking if do you know that they
4	after
5	A. No.
6	Q Nizar sent the letter, that's when they decided
7	they were not going to pay that rent?
8	A. I don't remember when I get the news.
9	Q. Okay.
10	A. Whether from Nizar or from you.
11	Q. Okay. All right.
12	A. I honestly don't remember.
13	Q. Okay.
14	A. There's nothing free. You could have a sit on my
15	chair for two or three hours, but you can't kick me out and

2	BY MR. HARTMANN:
3	Q. Okay. Have a couple redirect.
4	Sir, look again at Exhibit 1, if you would.
5	You have your own copy.
6	A. Yes.
7	Q. The letter that you said you've never seen.
8	A. This?
9	Q. Yeah.

5	Do you know if the address here at the top is
6	correct?
7	A. The address is correct, yes.
8	Q. Okay. And is the phone number correct?
9	A. Yes.
10	Q. And is the fax number correct?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. And would they have been correct in 2001?
13	A. No, this is an old number we have.
14	Q. Right. What I'm asking is, would would it have
15	been the number that was in effect in 2001?
16	A. Oh, yes, yes.
17	Q. Okay. And if you look at the address line, who
18	it's to, it says it's to Fathi Yusuf.
19	A. Oh, my God. I just noticed what I'm looking for.
20	The fax number underneath my address. That's my St. Thomas
21	fax number. This is my St. Thomas fax number, 775-5766.
22	Q. Okay. I was going to ask you about that.
23	A. That was the paper I was looking for.
24	Q. Oh, okay.
25	A. It was in front of me.

1	Q. Okay. Well, good.
2	A. Show me where show me this is a fax? Never
3	sent to me. I tell you, it never sent to me.
4	Q. Okay. Let me just ask you some questions about

10	never received, period.
11	Q. Okay.
12	A. And it says sent to me by fax, and the fax ID is
13	not on the page.
14	Q. Okay. And and the several times in the
15	letter, for instance, in the first paragraph on the next
16	page, it says it refers to Ben.
17	A. It's useless. Why you keep asking me for the same
18	thing, and I keep tell you, I never saw this before?
19	Q. I'm going to ask you a different question.
20	A. Are you trying to put words in my mouth?
21	Q. No.
22	A. I never. This letter is not familiar to me.
23	Q. I understand that. I'm going to ask you a
24	different question.
25	I'm now on the Page Number HAMD664268. It's

1	the second page.
2	A. Okay.
3	Q. And it says in the in the text, "There are
4	several other reports I keep for my use in collecting
5	rent and the accounts receivable sheet sent to Ben every
6	month."
7	Do you know who Ben is?
8	A. Ben is a gentleman, used to work with us in
9	St. Thomas, he's an accountant.
10	Q. He was your accountant?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. And then in the next paragraph down there that
13	starts, "Please let me know if you would like any of these
14	reports sent monthly or any other period. I send Ben #3,4 &
15	5 with the bank statement mid-month."
16	So Ben would be the accountant. And what
17	they're saying is that this person sends Items 3, 4, and 5
18	to Ben every month.
19	Who did Ben report to? Who is Ben's boss?
