**THIRD AMENDED JOINT DISCOVERY AND SCHEDULING PLAN**

**THIS MATTER** came before the Master on Yusuf and Hamed's joint motion for enlargement of the existing scheduling order by 90 days, filed on November 8, 2021.

On June 14, 2021, the Master approved the parties' joint proposed second amended scheduling order and entered a second amended scheduling order in this matter. In their instant joint motion, the parties explained:

...Presently there are depositions set for November 9-11, 2021, and thus the effect would be to move those to February 9-11, 2022, with all other dates being similarly moved.

Counsel for both sides represent that between Covid delays, family medical issues and the volume of materials involved in the last of the major "B(2)" claims, despite best efforts, the hearing, motions and discovery have been onerous. They assure the Special Master that the end of the major claims is clearly in sight.

Counsel for Hamed have agreed to the filing of this motion by counsel for Yusuf.

(Joint Motion.)

Having been advised with the premises, the Master will grant a 60-day enlargement of the deadlines set forth in the second amended scheduling order. Accordingly, it is hereby:

**ORDERED** that a 60-day enlargement of the deadlines set forth in the second amended scheduling order is **GRANTED**.
